Message from Our Rabbi

Shalom

There is a song that was written in the 1960's or 1970's titled "Shalom, Shalom." The words are not only meaningful, but they are eternal as well:

"Shalom, shalom, we say shalom, the nicest greeting I know. It means bonjour, salud, and skoal, and twice as much as hello. It means a million lovely things, like peace be yours, welcome home. And even when you say goodbye with Shalom."

Of course, there are more lyrics. It was a song made famous in the Broadway show, "Milk and Honey." The music is just as inviting, as are the lyrics. How could you not fall in love with the sentiments expressed?

I thought of this when I began to wonder as to why people are encouraged to identify with a particular faith and the house of worship associated with that belief. We know that many people become involved for various reasons. However, I firmly believe that the essence of the participation rests with the understanding that we are connected to each other in more ways than just being human beings.

We join with our co-religionists because there is a comfort in sitting in the pews, reciting the prayers, with all who seek the solace of a spiritual adventure. It really cannot be put into words because to properly understand the feelings would require untold hours and untold explanations.

Suffice it to say, we are here because our destinies are intertwined with each other. We are here because the generations that preceded us did the very same thing, for the very same reasons. Even the next generation, a little more removed from the history, will still gather together and repeat the same words, and experience the same feeling of accomplishment that we do now.

And yet, I find it difficult to understand the reluctance of many to remain apart. The latest statistics indicate that, in Greater Phoenix area, 76% of the Jewish population remains unaffiliated. Just think, only 24% are involved in sustaining Jewish life. Sad to say that the percentages have risen year after year.

So, when we take the time to honor those who have chosen to be part of our spiritual adventure, we are also rejoicing over our continuity and survival. In this age of disconnection, when we seem to be more divided than ever, it is remarkable that we are still able to offer tradition and modernity enhancing our religious experience. What is even more remarkable is that we continue to grow and fill the Chapel.

Our many activities testify to our ability to blend the old with the new, giving everyone an opportunity to sample and rejoice in our heritage. We are able to make our time together relevant, even as we sometimes feel irrelevant. Most of all, we feel complete when our experience ends because we have been both in a time warp consisting of the past, as well as a glimpse into the future.

This month we will celebrate and commemorate the new additions to our Temple family. We are honored that they have chosen to be part of us and we pray that their affiliation will be both rewarding and fulfilling. It will also recognize the many participants expending the energy to encourage all to enjoy all that we are.

With a New Year, we begin a new chapter in our history as a congregation. Our arms are open and welcoming. Our spirits lifted because of a new anticipation of things yet to be. Our hearts are filled with gladness because we are able to share our joy in reaching new heights in our journey of survival.

The Torah portion we read this month, Beresheet, signifies the beginning of everything. Perhaps we too will begin to understand the true meaning of love, sacrifice, reward, and fulfillment as signified by our commitment to the House we built together, and will continue to build for the future.

Cantorial Notes – A Song for Succot

Sukkot (The feast of Tabernacles) is one of the three pilgrimage festivals that commemorates our wandering in the desert after the Exodus from Egypt. During this holiday we build temporary shelters (booths) in remembrance of those that Hebrews lived in for 40 years while they crossed the Sinai desert after leaving Egypt. In accordance with instructions in Leviticus 23:42-43, Jews are instructed to "live in the sukkah for seven days, so your descendants will remember that I [the Lord] had the Israelites live in wilderness shelters when I brought them out of Egypt." Sukkot is celebrated over a seven-day period and all meals are eaten inside the booth. While in the sukkah, Jews are instructed to hold and wave four plants: hadas (leaves from the myrtle tree), aravah (leaves from the willow tree), etrog (fruit of the citron tree) and lulav (palm frond). The practice is outlined in



Leviticus 23:40: "On the first day you shall take the product of goodly trees, branches of palm trees, boughs of leafy trees, and willows of the brook, and you shall rejoice before the Lord your God for seven days." There are blessings that accompany the ritual of holding and shaking these plants and it is also customary to socialize and sing songs in this structure.

One of my favorite songs for Sukkot is Ufros Aleinu. In Hebrew it is simply "Ufros aleinu sukat sh'lomecha" and in English "spread over us your tabernacle of peace." I like these lyrics for Sukkot as it helps to channel our feeling of God's protection as we spend time in our sukkah and/or contemplate the Israelites wandering in the desert and living in temporary structures. Just as the Israelites needed God's protection then, so do we still need God's protection and the sense of peace that comes from knowing His shelter is always available to us. Whether it is a symbolic tabernacle of peace that is spread over us in prayer or the physical tabernacles or booths of Sukkot, the result is the same...a community that is drawn together and sheltered in the love of God.

Nominating Committee Report

Geri Gould chaired the 2015 nominating committee to identify candidates for five SLJC Board positions beginning January 2016. Committee members included Sandy Jennings, Joyce Spartonos, Lana Oyer, and Jeff Burnce.

We met June 18, 2015, and spent several hours discussing what criteria would be useful assets for potential members, and then generated a list of some 15 potential candidates. After further discussion, we prioritized the candidates and then began to make phone calls to determine willingness to serve. Fortunately, in very short order, we had three individuals who accepted the challenge and will represent our slate. In September one of the candidates had to withdraw. The candidates are Doris Codkind, and Betsey Silverman. In addition Marty Silverman and Wende Levy will be running for re-election. The process also includes seeking open nominations from the floor during the annual Congregational Meeting scheduled for Oct. 29th. The remaining board position will remain vacant until January when, in accordance with the SLJC Bylaws, a person may be appointed to fill a specific role needed on the board.

During the Congregational Meeting, each of these two candidates will deliver a short bio describing their connection to SLJC and their interest in serving the BOD. Assuming no other nominations arise from the floor, the plan is to have them elected as a slate that night and then be invited to attend the November board meeting to transition and to get a grasp of the roles of the officers so that election of officers of the BOD can take place during the December 2015 meeting.



Thank you so much for your consideration. We know we can have another great year by joining forces.


Paper Copies of The Shpiel


SLJC Friends of Israel Host Meir Jolovitz, Past National Director of ZOA

The Sun Lakes Jewish Congregation Friends of Israel will be sponsoring a presentation on <u>Sunday October 25th at 3 PM in the Sun Lakes Chapel Center</u> that will include a short video presentation followed by a guest speaker. There is no cost to attend this presentation and anyone in the area is welcome to attend. Light refreshments will be served and there will be NO SOLICITATION of funds.

The video will be from "The Case for Israel: Democracy's Outpost." which presents a vigorous case for Israel – for its basic right to exist, to protect its citizens from terrorism, and to defend its borders from hostile enemies. It features Alan Dershowitz, Felix Frankfurter Professor of Law at Harvard Law School, who has achieved international distinction as one of Israel's most prominent and articulate advocates.

The guest speaker, Meir Jolovitz, will discuss the video presentation and answer questions from the audience. He is the former National Director of the Zionist Organization of America (ZOA) was born in Israel, and has a Master's Degree in International Relations and Political Theory. His father survived 13 death camps.

In previous presentations he has stated: "The Iran nuclear treaty is worthless because Iran openly intends on violating the agreement". "There is a misunderstanding about the Middle East. It is not war over territory, it is about the existence of Israel". "The United Nations' treatment of Israel is unfair. The U. N. is home to 57 Muslim countries where there is no rule of law and they are joined by an equal number of nations who have never known democracy, and they stand in judgment of Israel."

News from Israel

An Israeli company "New CO₂ Fuels" has developed a machine that will convert large quantities of CO₂ into oxygen and "syngas" (carbon monoxide and hydrogen) using a process of artificial photosynthesis. The syngas can then be converted into fuel (methanol, ethanol, gasoline), fertilizer (kerosene ammonia, urea), plastics, etc. The process requires a lot of heat, which would be supplied either by solar panels or by installing the machines at places like steel mills, which generate large quantities of wasteful heat. This is a win-win situation, since the mills are already required to reduce their CO₂ emissions. This conversion process is already being used around the world. What makes "New CO₂ Fuels" unique is that its patented technology allows it to convert CO₂ into fuel more efficiently and at lower cost than its competitors can. In 2014, New CO₂ Fuels won the prestigious World Technology Award, presented at the UN.
