RABBI IRWIN WIENER, D.D.

The Power of the Spirit



More than 24 centuries ago a prophet in Israel declared that the most potent and enduring force in the world was not that of material wealth or physical strength, but the power of the spirit. For example, supporting institutions of caring and sharing affords us the

opportunity to understand what true faith is all about — what we humans are all about. We understand that humankind is capable of good things, heavenly things without regard for material gain or selfish motives. This time of the year affords us the opportunity to extend ourselves for others.

Fasting on Yom Kippur may relieve our conscience, but that is all it does. We are instructed to afflict our souls. The Talmud explains that this means fasting — depriving ourselves of those things that represent benefits. But the true value of fasting, whether completely or in part, is to awaken within us the understanding that our sacrifice should help us appreciate the less fortunate — and do something about it.

And approaching a maturing stage of life is no excuse for ignoring our responsibilities. *Tikkun olam*, the continuing repair in the tear of the fabric of mankind's journey, requires constant participation. It is not enough to acknowledge the problems. We are obligated, as partners with God, to ensure that the tear is repaired to the best of our ability.

Each tear and each repair can bring us closer to understanding our place in this experience we call life. And the High Holiday season, Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, help remind us that we are nothing without deeds. We are nothing without purpose. And only when we lift a person who has fallen, can we, with pride, declare who we are and truly comprehend the connection of Heaven and Earth.

This time of the year enables us to recollect as well as plan for tomorrow. We are asking for forgiveness of the past and making wishes for a future more prosperous in many ways even though we don't know what the future holds. Will these wishes include more than just

our desires and needs? Will these wishes encompass the action necessary to fulfill the mission of spiritual enlightenment?

Our lives are so temporary. A wind can come and blow us away. Rain can fall and soak our dreams and aspirations. Fire can consume our shelter and even destroy our lives. This is the challenge our season of renewal represents.

Our shelter from life's storm is the support we extend to those in need. Our comfort in the face of adversity is the helping hand we offer to our fellowman. The fire that burns should be inside of us as we fight injustice and poverty and famine and homelessness.

A story is told about an old man who sat outside the walls of a great city. When travelers approached, they would ask the old man: "What kind of people live in this city?" And the old man would answer: "What kind of people lived in the place where you came from?" If the travelers answered: "Only bad people lived in the place where we came from," then the old man would reply: "Continue on, for you will only find bad people here."

But if the travelers answered: "Only good people lived in the place where we came from," then the old man would say: "Enter, for here too you will only find good people."

There is no doubt that good people live everywhere. Humanity records speaks for itself. The many agencies designed to ensure continuity and survival are a testament to that goodness. We don't ask, "Why?" Rather we ask, "How?" How can we as a people respond to the bad things that occur every single day — not as punishment for some imagined sin, but rather because things are the way they are, and it is our responsibility to share in the Creation process by doing what we can to alleviate the suffering that is part of the human experience. That is our partnership with God.

The prophets of long ago spoke the truth about the spirit being the most potent force in the world and we are living proof. My prayer is that the year just beginning will encompass a light that leads us from despair and will never be extinguished. And the sound of the Shofar we hear will stir in us a greater understanding of the partnership, and we will respond accordingly.

LONE SOLDIER PROJECT OUR PROJECT IS NOW FIVE YEARS OLD!



In five, years with the help of many volunteers from SLJC, we have accomplished a great deal:

Partnered with three Lone Soldier Centers in Israel: Chayal el Chayal, The Michael Levin Lone Soldier Center, and Osey Chail Association (for Haredi Soldiers).

Sent \$2800+ to Israel for Shabbat and holiday meals at all three centers.

Sent over 225 home-knitted hats to soldiers for cold winter assignments.

Educated youth and adults throughout the state of Arizona about the courage and commitment to

Israel that all Lone Soldiers possess and the challenges they experience.

Developed successful Hanukkah Greeting Campaigns, involving contact with over 600 people annually and yielding over 800 cards for Lone Soldiers each year in collaboration with 24 Phoenix religious and day schools, synagogues, and youth groups. Tucson JCC and Hebrew Academy and Flagstaff Chabad are now partners.


SOMETHING YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW ABRAHAM MATZA

What or who was Abraham Matza? It sounds like an item you might purchase for Passover; Abraham was a Greek Jew who grew up in the Bronx and is a littleknown hero of World War 2. The Matza family were members of the Romaniote Jewish Community in Ioannina, Greece. Much of his family did not immigrate to the U.S. and were arrested when the Nazis invaded Greece. They were all sent to Auschwitz where they perished.

Abraham wished to avenge his family about whom all contact was lost. He joined the U.S. Army and was assigned to the 289th Infantry Regiment, which found itself in the midst of the Battle of the Bulge. On January 6, 1945, his unit was patrolling near Manhay, Belgium when they were attacked by a larger German force.

Abraham realized that they were severely outnumbered, so he told his comrades to retreat while he held off the enemy. Fiiring his Browning Automatic Rifle (BAR), he confronted the German force, killing more than 30 of them before he was killed. The following day,



the American troops returned to the location, finding Abraham's body riddled with many bayonet wounds. He had given up his life to save his buddies. Abraham was buried with honors in the Henri-Chapelle American Cemetery in Belgium.

The service is designed to give us an opportunity to remember members of our families and friends who are no longer with, and as to recall the happiness that was shared when they walked among us.

We will whisper their names, we will cherish their memories, and we will connect to the past as we endeavor to prepare for our future in the year ahead.

It is a beautiful ceremony recalling the flight of time as well as encouraging us to gain strength from the lives of loved ones. Some losses are recent and some more distant, but all involving the recollection of achievements and defeats that make up our journey of life. Join me and the Cantor on Sunday, October 2 at 10:30 am for this service at the Valley of the Sun Cemetery. Although many of our loved ones are not necessarily there, we use this venue as a reminder of all the locations of our bereavement. Also, at this sacred time in this sacred place, we will recall the men and women of our armed forces who lost their lives on distant shores, those who perished in the atrocities of the Holocaust, those whose lives were destroyed during the pandemic, and the victims of the heinous crimes occurring in Ukraine.

This year we will also bury sacred writings or religious objects and visit the of graves of those members and families buried at this cemetery. If you have sacred books, such as Bibles or religious objects, including mezzuzot, please bring them with you for burial.

The service is open to all members of the Jewish community.

NEW CHAPEL ENTRY


